

ACEDH ALERTE CONGOLAISE POUR L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET LES DROITS DE L'HOMME

Descriptions

As part of its African Climate Legal Fellowship Program supported by File foundation/ IREX a global development education organization, the ACEDH Intern Host Organization, is seeking to recruit "a legal officer" who will be assigned to the Executive Secretariat, the Legal and Climate Justice Department.

This role is part of the African Climate Legal Fellowship Programme (ACLFP), a pilot initiative to bring experienced lawyers to the environmental public interest sector in Africa and enable new talent to enter the public interest sector. In addition to their position at CRADESC, the fellows will be part of a broader cohort benefiting from mentorship, coaching and leadership development, training in environmental and climate change law and science, and a network of like-minded African lawyers. Travel to Africa for a kick-off meeting will also be necessary. IREX, a global nonprofit organization that has supported more than 50,000 fellows over 50 years, will implement the fellowship and provide ongoing support to you and your nonprofit.

The successful candidate will be responsible for supporting the legal and climate justice program in activities related to strategic litigation, legal assistance, analysis, design, drafting of acts and reports, planning of mobile courts, community audit session, community mobilization, support for studies and work plans for specific files related to legal issues, social safeguard, arguments, Advocacy Note and Legal Aid.

The Congolese Alert for the Environment and Human Rights (ACEDH) is a non-profit organization under Congolese law, with headquarters in Goma and Kitshanga in North Kivu, in the eastern part of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Created in 2008, ACEDH dreams of a fairer world where people and their environment are put at the centre of all action and concern in governance.
